Thoughts from our Principal ...

Lessons learned from shoveling this past week...

Perhaps you live on a street where all this white stuff falling from the sky has accumulated in very large amounts this past Saturday and Sunday. If so, then I am sure you will be able to empathize with some of the musings from this physical activity we call, "shoveling snow."

First, shoveling snow is hard work. Whether with a small tool or state-of-the-art-bent-handle scooper, wearing three layers of clothing and outdoor gear and going outside in the blustery weather is no picnic. Putting the shovel to the ground and digging out a couple feet of snow the length of what-feels-like a football field takes a lot of muscle. Back muscle. Forearm muscle. Lift-from-your-leg muscle.
