At the same time, we also want to wish each of YOU a Happy New Year! It is 2025! It is hard to believe, but here we are in a brand new year with a fresh start. It is picture perfect. Speaking of pictures...

How many of you like taking pictures, snapshots and/or photographs? I really like taking pics and have a long appreciation for photography. I'm nowhere near professional or very good at it, but I have enjoyed taking pictures ever since I was in grade school. I bought my first SLR with a "fancy lens" when I was in Grade 12 – a Minolta. I have taken so many pictures in my life that when I was cleaning my closet and drawers, I had boxes and boxes of prints from year's past. Before the digital age, I had to wait to see if my roll of 24 pictures were any good. I would go to Black's Photography and hope for the best – ready in one week. But if I paid extra (because I was especially impatient to see the pictures turn out) I could pick them up in 24 hours!

Whatever it is, pictures can provide a narrative with joys and wonder.

As we look ahead to 2025, we might need to pause and "frame a picture" or two to help us pay attention to a particular moment or event. Taking time to observe or notice things gives us pause for reflection so that 2025 does not speed right past us. In addition to noticing big and small moments, let us also make an ef-

fort to share a series of pictures so that we can tell stories to each other. Show and tell about who people are in our life, what we did in school, what we did outside of school, a flower we passed by, a fast car that we saw on the road, a bug, a pet, a mountain, a grandparent, the rooftop of a building, a sunset on the horizon, a youth retreat, or a hockey team. Whatever lies ahead in 2025, enjoy people and places, moments and memories that remind us God is present, that He is always near, and that He wants us to share our stories about Him. May we honour him this year and remember that even when we don't know all the details, God has the big picture. To Him be all glory and praise this year and always.
