Thoughts from our Principal ...

I hate weeds. Actually, let me clarify. I dislike weeding (I shouldn't use the word, "hate.") This past weekend, I had no excuse but to spend the day outside where the sun was shining and my husband, Tim, had set aside time to work on our backyard. It's not a big back yard – a lawn, some tall grass along the fence, bushes and orange, white and pink flowers that bloom at different times. We also have a vegetable and herb garden that will quickly dry up if not watered regularly, something I learned last summer, but of course obvious to everyone else. Tim is the green thumb in our family, and if it wasn't for him, we would have dry dirt and weeds because that's all I know. So, with his help, he tells me what is a weed and what is a bush/plant/herb and then I pull it out with our weed-puller-thingy or bare hands.

Equipped with a hat, light clothing, rubber footwear, glass of water, tools and a brown paper bag for the debris, I set out to conquer and eliminate that which was nutrient-sucking, prickly, overgrown, damaging and unwanted.

I had lots of time to think about weeds as I was doing my time. As time progressed, sadly but aware of my level of energy, my mood was deteriorating, and my strength was depleting. But before everything was zapped away, here are some take aways as I reflected on the act of pulling weeds that may – or may not – relate to life.

First, weeds are damaging. When tending a garden and wanting it to flourish, removing weeds that by nature take away soil and water from other plants/grass/flowers is necessary.

Second, we need to take time to remove the dandelions in our life, preferably by the root. It has less chance of coming back too quickly, if at all.

Third, using a tool like a "weed puller thingy" and/or just a basic knife are helpful in plucking them out. Use what you can. Maybe have a strategy and maybe even prioritize if necessary. But set out to get those rascals.

Fourth, this is hard work. It is not done after one shot. So, I know I will have to get back at this exercise next weekend, and the next, and the next...

What is the "hidden message" or reminders from this spring season? Some may call, "weeds" the "messy things in life" or some may call them, "sin." I came to the conclusion that I need to pay attention to the things that are obstacles to flourishing. As much as I dislike pulling weeds, I will say that the hard work was essential. My back was sore, my hamstrings were tight, and Tim and I could hardly move that evening. But when we looked at the garden after all that labour, we loved this little bit of paradise. In the end, we know it was worth it!


