

The Emblem of the Willowdale Christian School


(Adopted in November 1975)




The basic fact of a school is that it deals with people. They live, communicate and interact with each other. This is the symbolic background and pattern of the emblem.



The central and essential theme of our interacting community is Christ. He has given us salvation and redemption. The cross is therefore the central part of the emblem.



The three main parts of our life in Christ deal with the home, the church and the school. These must be based on the cross of Christ. The boxes represent these three main parts of our lives.



The graduating black and white lines indicate Christ's commandment that we grow and increase in Biblical wisdom. This development is expected in the home, the church and in the school.



The completed emblem:

(a) The emblem can either be depicted in three colours, or in black and white. The symbolic meaning of the colours are: (i) Blue — Heavenly colour — the church (ii) Red — Colour of love — the home (iii) Green — Colour of learning — the school.

(b) Colossians 2:19 was selected as the verse that was most appropriate to the meaning of the emblem. From this text, the following summary was taken "IN CHRIST WE GROW".
